

What is Dual Enrollment?



Dual Enrollment is an opportunity for students to take college classes & earn college credits while in high school.



Dual Enrollment is NOT Early College!

In general, most college partners allow students to take one 3-credit course per semester, with some allowing students to take up to two courses.



Disclaimer

ALL interested & eligible students must reapply! If you recently applied for summer dual enrollment or if you were previously accepted, you MUST reapply.

Ed Equity Lab

- Student Application Opened March 10
- For currently enrolled DCPS students in grades 9-11
- College courses offered during the school day as part of the high school schedule. Schools opt in & select course.
- Ask your school if they are an Ed Equity Lab school!

Advanced Technical Center

- Talk to your school counselor to enroll
- For currently enrolled DCPS students in grades 9-11
- College courses through Trinity Washington University aligned to cybersecurity and nursing.
- Students go off campus to a center to take college-level classes with other students from the city.

Who can apply?

- Currently enrolled *10th &11th grade DCPS students with a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA
 - *10th grade applicants (rising juniors) can <u>ONLY</u> apply to Howard University in the DCPS Private Universities program
 - o 9th grade students (rising sophomores) are <u>NOT</u> eligible to apply to the DCPS Private Universities program

Required application materials:

- Completed online application
- DCPS high school transcript
- Essays

- DCPS Counselor or Principal recommendation form
- DCPS Release of information form [Español]
- Teacher letter of recommendation (no form)

DCPS Private Universities Dual Enrollment program acceptance is valid for the fall & spring semesters, pending successful fall course completion as outlined by the university.

What college should I apply to?

Classes in the DCPS Private Universities Dual Enrollment program are in-person, on the college campus! When choosing what college(s) to apply to, consider the following:

Campus Location

Choose a campus that you are able to consistently commute to and from.

What time of day are you able to take a dual enrollment course?

Example: 1st period, afterschool, etc.

<u>NOTE:</u> To take a dual enrollment course during the school day, students must receive school counselor approval!

What subject or type of class are you interested in taking?

Example: pre-calculus, humanities, required first-year college student courses, etc.

How to Apply?

Step 1) Request and prepare all required application documents.

- Essays and the release form must be uploaded at the time of application.
- o The high school transcript, counselor form, and teacher letter of recommendation can be uploaded to the application by the school counselor <u>after student submission</u>.
- All application materials are due by April 4, 2025.

Step 2) Complete the online application.

- Visit <u>bit.ly/DCPSPrivate</u> to complete the online application. The application <u>must be</u>
 completed in <u>one sitting</u>. You will not have the option to save your application and return to it later.
- Once all application fields (excluding the "Counselor Section") have been completed, click "SAVE & CLOSE" to submit your application. If you do not click "SAVE & CLOSE", your application will not be received!



Application Reminders!

- Students are responsible for requesting their high school transcript, counselor recommendation form, and teacher letter of recommendation be completed/uploaded before the deadline.
 - o Follow your school's timeline for requesting transcripts and letters of recommendation
- Students can rank up to 4 colleges!
- Students will NOT be able to log back into the dual enrollment application to edit the application.
- School counselors have access to student dual enrollment applications to support in uploading materials and application edits.

Who Can Apply?

- Currently enrolled DCPS students in grades 9-11 are eligible to apply for summer semester dual enrollment.
- GPA & grade-level eligibility is determined by each participating college.
- View the <u>OSSE Consortium eligibility chart</u> to determine what schools you are eligible to apply to. Do not confuse this eligibility chart with the list of required application materials

Program Costs:

- OSSE will cover the cost of tuition and books for accepted/enrolled students.
- Students are responsible for additional course material expenses (ex: art supplies).
- If taking classes on the college campus, students are responsible for transportation to and from campus.

How many schools can I apply to?

In the OSSE Consortium Dual Enrollment application, students **must select the "type" of college** they are interested in attending: University, Community College, or UDC CARE. Each college type has different application requirements, which is why students must choose only one college type.

- University: Bard College, Bowie State University, George Mason University, Marymount University, Trinity Washington University, & Virginia State University
- <u>Community College:</u> Montgomery College, Northern
 Virginia Community College, & Prince George's Community
 College
- UDC CARE: University of the District of Columbia

Within the college type you have selected, students can rank up to 3 schools, in order of preference (1 being your top choice). Students who select UDC can only apply to UDC.





Before starting the application, determine the following:

- What colleges am I eligible to apply to?
- o Of those schools, which college is the best fit? (campus location, class format, & classes offered).



- After completing Part 1, click "SAVE & CLOSE".
 - After clicking "SAVE & CLOSE", students will receive an email to create login credentials within 48
 hours to be able to log back into the application.
- The submit button should <u>only</u> be clicked after ALL application materials are uploaded, including counselor & teacher uploads.

Request and prepare all required application documents.

- Students are responsible for ensuring all application documents are received and uploaded to their application by the semester deadlines.
 - All supporting documents must be in PDF format.
 - Do not wait until February 25 to request your materials. Remember the application closes on 2/25!



Required Application Materials:

Students are responsible for ensuring all application documents are received and uploaded to their application by the semester deadlines.

- DCPS high school transcript [GPA must be included]
- OSSE Counselor or Principal Recommendation Form
 - Students are responsible for requesting this be completed AND ensuring it is uploaded before the deadline.
- OSSE Signed Release of Information Form (English) (Spanish)
- Essay**
- OSSE Teacher Recommendation Form*
 - Completed teacher forms must be shared with the student's school counselor to be uploaded.
 - Students are responsible for requesting this be completed AND ensuring it is uploaded before the deadline.

^{*}Students applying to UDC or Community Colleges** within the OSSE Consortium Dual Enrollment program are not required to provide an essay or teacher recommendation form!

^{** 9}th grade students applying to NOVA Community College will need an essay.

OSSE Consortium Dual Enrollment I Applied – What's Next?



Only completed applications will be sent for college/university review!

A completed application will have all required materials completed & uploaded by the program deadline.

If accepted, you will:

- 1. Admission decisions will be released via email. After program acceptance, students will be required to confirm their "Intent to Enroll".
- 2. Once confirmed, students will receive enrollment next-steps and course registration instructions directly from the college/university they were accepted to.
 - This information will be sent to the student ONLY.
 - Students are responsible for checking the email they provided in the application and completing the enrollment steps outlined by their college/university.
- 4. Your college/university advisor will host orientation sessions prior to the start of the semester.

Dual Enrollment Grades

Dual Enrollment participation by default is for college credits **ONLY**.

Students interested in earning high school credit for their dual enrollment course must submit the <u>Dual Credit Request Form</u> with all required signatures by end-of-semester deadlines (no exceptions):

Fall 2024 deadline:

January 27, 2025

Spring 2025 deadline:

June 18, 2025

Summer 2025 deadline:

November 3, 2025

Dual Enrollment Grades


- If your request to receive dual credit is approved, the dual enrollment grade earned will be reported on the official DCPS high school transcript (grades A through F, including withdrawals).
- DCPS credit will only be awarded for approved courses which are completed and passed with a grade of C or better. This grade will be calculated with the weight of an AP course as a part of each student's GPA.

Dual Enrollment courses taken for dual credit can impact the college course's transferability!

 Students must meet with their HS school counselor prior to submitting the dual credit request form to determine if dual credit is an appropriate option.
