


CHALLENGE YOUR SELF ACADEMICALLY

- · The most important admissions factor colleges consider is your academic profile, which includes your GPA, and the challenging courses you are taking throughout high school.
- Your GPA also helps determine which colleges are Smart College Choices for you.
- Research what rigorous courses are available at your school! (For example - Honors, Advance Placement, IB, and Dual Credit).

PREPARE FOR PSAT/SAT

- · Test Scores are used by some colleges to assess your academic preparedness for college. The PSAT test is an essential precursor to the SAT test.
- Test Scores may be used for scholarship and merit aid consideration. Do your research!
- Practice! Studying for the SAT for 20 hours using Khan Academy can lead to a 115-point average score increase.
